

lcohol and drug impaired motor vehicle crash fatalities prevail year after year in Texas. Justices of the Peace (JPs) act as death investigators to determine if alcohol and/or drugs contributed to crashes. As coroners, JPs play a crucial role contributing to the state's quantitative depiction of impaired driving crashes.

## Why Report BAC and Toxicology Results to TxDOT

- Blood alcohol concentration (BAC) and toxicology results point to regions in the state where impaired driving is negatively affecting the community
- The level of federal funding that the Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT)
  receives to address impaired driving partially depends upon BAC and toxicology
  results being reported
- The Texas Transportation Code 550.081 mandates reporting

# What to Report in a Fatal Crash that Occurred on a Public Roadway

- The name of the deceased and a statement identifying whether the deceased was the operator or passenger of the vehicle involved in the crash, or if the deceased was a pedestrian or non-occupant of the vehicle
- Include the date, county and if a bridge collapsed in the fatal crash
- Add the BAC/toxicology information: the name of the laboratory, medical examiner's office, or other facility that conducted toxicological testing relative to the deceased along with the results, if available

## **How to Report BAC and Toxicology Results to TxDOT**



Toxicology reporting is done before the 11th day of each calendar month



Fill out the initial TxDOT CR-1001 — Death/ Toxicology Report and attach the full autopsy/ toxicology results, if available

If the BAC/
toxicology
results were not
available prior
to the initial
reporting,
once results
are at hand,
JPs are to email
the full results
to TxDOT



Your email should contain the CR-1001 attached as a supplement and the full toxicology/ autopsy results



When filling out

TxDOT's preferred method: CR-1001 Form + full autopsy/ toxicology results sent to TxDOT's email address.
