

### **Justice of the Peace Traffic Fatalities Inquest Card**

Alcohol and drug impaired motor vehicle crash fatalities continue year after year in Texas. As part of your authority, Justice of the Peace (JP) determine if alcohol and/or drugs contribute to these crashes. As coroners, JPs play a crucial role by reporting toxicology results of drivers involved in impaired driving crashes. Regions in the state where impaired driving is negatively affecting the community are defined by blood alcohol (BAC) and drug concentrations toxicology results. The Texas Department of Transportation needs your jurisdiction's Death/Toxicology information in alcohol and drug driving motor vehicle crash fatalities. Your reporting helps the state make informed decisions on impaired driving behavior modifications and traffic safety improvements. Reporting toxicology is the first and most important step you can take. Do your part by following these simple steps.






