2020 Ignition Interlock Penetration Case Study:

Montgomery County, Texas

Case Study

To explore the penetration of ignition interlocks, the Texas A&M Transportation Institute partnered with the Montgomery County District Attorney's Office to review driving while intoxicated (DWI) cases where ignition interlocks were ordered. Researchers explored DWI cases from 2015 and found:

- 11% of DWI cases requiring an ignition interlock as a condition of bond were not ordered a device
- 15% of DWI cases requiring an ignition interlock as a condition of probation were not ordered a device
- 24% of convicted DWI offenders had their ignition interlock removed before the minimum time requirements were completed



Did You Know?

Texas requires ignition interlocks for the following offenses?*

Condition of Bond	Condition of Probation
Subsequent Offenses	50% of probation term for subsequent offenses
Intoxication Assault	50% of probation term for defendants under 21 years old
Intoxication Manslaughter	DWI with a BAC>=0.15
DWI with a Child Passenger	

*A judge may waive the ignition interlock requirement if it is in the best interest of justice.

From 2015 to 2020, there were: 101 FATALITIES resulting from an alcohol-impaired driving crash which accounted for 31% OF ALL CRASH FATALITIES in Montgomery County, Texas









1. Judges should ask questions to identify if any of the automatic ignition interlock requirements are met.

- a. Has the defendant had a prior DWI?
- b. How old was the defendant at the time of arrest?
- c. Did the defendant have a BAC above 0.15?
- 2. Judges and prosecutors should receive **education** on ignition interlocks and applicable laws in Texas.
- 3. Prosecutors should **notify judges** when automatic ignition interlock requirements are met.
- 4. Researchers should work with the judiciary to **identify factors** used when ordering and not ordering ignition interlocks.
- 5. Judges and prosecutors should be made aware of any **financial assistance** offered by ignition interlock providers in Montgomery County, Texas.
